May is National Bike Month, and here in Massachusetts we are celebrating with Bay State Bike Week! The signature event of Bike Week is the MassCommuter Challenge (May 14th-20th). The Challenge is a friendly competition amongst Massachusetts businesses, educational institutions and municipalities in which employees, students and residents support their "teams" -based on where they work, go to school or live- by pledging to bike for all or part of trips. Participation is free and open to anyone who lives, works or attends school in Massachusetts!

Celebrating Tufts' Sustainability

A few weeks ago at the Sustainability Roundtable, sustainability leaders discussed what Tufts needs to work on as a university and as a community to be more sustainable. The roundtable also discussed the fact that it is important to remember and to celebrate the accomplishments that we have already achieved.

Tufts Now recently published a fantastic article recounting Tufts' environmental accomplishments, such as organizing the Talloires Declaration in 1990 and detailing the recently built LEED certified buildings at Tufts, including the LEED Silver Dental School addition and the planned LEED Gold Biology Labs on Boston Ave. The article also gives an overview on the not-so-glamorous aspects of Tufts' sustainability efforts, including replacing traditional bulbs on the Residential Quad with energy- conserving CFLs.

The Grab Bag


