ON CAMPUS:

- CLOSE and lock all your windows and doors.
- Turn ALL your lights off. (remove Holiday Lights)

of Nutrition Science and Policy. He will discuss the environmental damage from grazing livestock, which is a significant issue in the US and globally. The US has made a significant conservation investment to mitigate the degradation of water quality on grasslands, through the Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP), managed by US Department of Agriculture. Professor Griffin will analyze the distribution and extent of the implementation of these practices in the eastern one-half of the US.

- Turn your computer and monitor OFF.

- Make sure all faucets and showers are turned off. Report any drips or leaks.
- Empty room of all perishable food items.
- Those who have FISH please TAKE them HOME with you.
- Ideally, you will unplug everything from your outlets - this will save extra energy.
