\$15 million allocated for energy-efficient lighting

Energy Secretary Steven Chu announced last June 7 that nearly \$15 million have been earmarked for eight new research and development projects related to high-efficiency, solid-state lighting (SSL) technologies like LEDs and OLEDs.

Light-emitting diodes (LEDs) and organic light-emitting diodes (OLEDs) have the potential to be ten times more energy-efficient than conventional incandescent lighting and can last up to 25 times as long. The projects are located across four states and focuses on core technology research, product development, and expanding domestic manufacturing capacity

Eco-Ambassadors tour Genzyme building

On June 15, this year's Eco-Ambassadors went on a little field trip to 500 Kendall Square to tour Genzyme Center, a LEED Platinum Certified building that has won awards for its environmentally responsible design.

The tour began in the light-filled atrium and passed through an indoor garden area, a catwalk with automatically controlled windows and blinds, and a sunny cafeteria on the top floor. The 350,000 SF building

was built on brownfield land and has several features that were custom-built to save energy and use natural light, including a vegetative roof, reflective ceiling panels and smart plumbing.

The impressive atrium, from which a prismatic chandelier made up of 768 tiles hangs from the skylight/ceiling, is actually open to the public, so if you're in the neighborhood, drop by and have a look. More information about the Genzyme Center can be found here.
