Green Tip of the Week: **Bottle Recycling has gone** Caps-On!

WIth Recycle Mania in full swing, you might be wondering what exactly can be recycled. You may be surprised to learn that one commonly-held belief about plastic recycling is outdated: The Association of Postconsumer Plastic Recyclers (APR) now asks that caps and closures be kept on plastic bottles and containers at the point of recycling.

Until recently, the plastics recycling industry was not able to effectively recycle bottles with caps on so the
