The Executive Office of Energy & Environmental Affairs will hold a series of 8 public hearings around the state about the proposed range of greenhouse gas emission limits and its implementation plan. EOEEA will also accept written comments until July 15. A framework document on the draft plan and background documents are posted on the DEP website. EOEAA is required by the Massachusetts Global Warming Solutions Act to set a GHG emissions reduction target between 10 and 25 percent below 1990 levels to be achieved by 2020 and develop an implementation plan.
