The Library Information Technology Support (LITS) group implemented the first of several "green" technology initiatives when it replaced its staff computers' power strip/surge protectors with a "Green" energy saving power strip, which will be configured to turn off peripherals when the monitor is powered off and save energy during instances when the computer needs to be left on to receive updates overnight. The next project is the installation of Powersave software which will allow ITS to remotely "wake up" computers that have been turned off overnight via a software program whenever they need to receive updates.

American Institute of Architects select Top Green Projects

The American Institute of Architects (AIA)'s Committee on the Environment has selected the top ten examples of sustainable architecture and green design solutions for 2011. The new Research Support Facility at DOE's National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) was among the projects on AIA Top Ten Green Projects list, now in its 15th year. The jury noted that NREL's structure serves as a challenge to the building industry and a blueprint for it to pursue low-energy performance projects.

The Green Projects program celebrates projects that result from thoroughly integrated approaches to architecture, natural systems, and technology that

The well-attended event featured a keynote presentation by Barbra Batshalom, Executive Director of the Sustainable Performance Institute, and four panel discussions on Sustainable Development, Sustainable Cities, Sustainable Technology and Sustainable Policy. The day ended with a reception and poster presentations from a broad range of topics, including "Green Keynesianism", The Tufts Community Agriculture Project, catalysts in sustainable hydrogen generation, and trayless dining.

include the use of sustainable or renewable construction materials.

Among the other winners were a <u>rebuilt school in</u> tornado-ravaged Greensburg, Kansas, that uses a 50-kilowatt wind turbine to provide a portion of its electricity. DOE has supported the city since leaders asked for help in making the community a model of sustainability following the devastation on May 4, 2007. AIA also cited a 20,000-square-foot addition to the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed national historic landmark Meeting House that is approximately 40% more efficient than a comparable base case facility as well as British Columbia's Vancouver Convention Centre West. The convention center is the world's first LEED Platinum convention center and includes Canada's largest living roof, which hosts some 400,000 indigenous plants on 6 acres. Globalization, suburban development, and government regulation are all contributing factors to the decline of industries that helped define the image of New England. A new exhibition by photographer Markham Starr at the Tufts University Art Gallery documents dairy farmers in Connecticut, trap fishermen off the coast of Rhode Island, and workers at the now-closed Stinson Seafood Cannery in Maine. Various economic and legislative pressures have contributed to the decline of these traditional New England livelihoods and Starr's photographs capture what may be the last vestiges of once-booming industries.


