Vegetables!!






Join the <u>Tufts Institute of the Environment</u> (TIE) for a screening of the new climate change documentary, "Climate Refugees." Panelists will include:

<u>Climate Refugees</u> has been called "an agent for social

change", "a resounding wake-up call for every human", and "the most important documentary made in the last 30 years". Director Michael Nash became interested in mass migrations caused by climate change: people looking for water and food in dry regions of Africa and losing their homes to rising seawater in Bangladesh. For this documentary, he visited locations from Orissa, India, where the coastal village of Kanhapura has



vanished, to the South Pacific island of Tuvalu, which is slowly being submerged by the rising ocean.
