General Overview

Devote 2-5 hours per month on sustainability-focused activities to further the institution's sustainability goals. Also, to develop your professional skills and encourage collaboration between likeminded individuals.

Primary Responsibilities of the Position

- Integrate sustainability into everyday activities around campus through collaboration with the Office of Sustainability and other departments.
- Deliver sustainability focused information and implement successful behavior change campaigns in your department, making sustainability fun and easy!
- Serve as a model for sustainable behavior and as an optimistic, accessible, and knowledgeable point of contact within your office for questions about sustainability facts, policies, procedures, news, and events.
- Engage colleagues in sustainability campaigns including Zero-Waste Week and the Green Office Certification Challenge
- Encourage staff, faculty and students to:
 - o Reduce energy use
 - Explore transportation alternatives to work
 - Understand certifications for purchasing products and explore sustainable options
 - Host green meetings and events
 - o Improve waste diversion on campus
 - o Reduce water consumption when opportunities are available
- Explore opportunities to create a Green Team within your department, floor or building.
- Attend Eco-Ambassador get-togethers quarterly.
- Share ideas, suggestions, questions, and successes with other Eco-Ambassadors and the Office of Sustainability.
- Notify the Office of Sustainability if you are leaving the university.

Time Commitment

 An average of 2-5 hours per month of work time (with permission of your supervisor)



Qualifications

- Interested in sustainability and a desire to be involved in making change happen on campus.
- Effective communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to share sustainability information and model behaviors at work.
