### 4. What steps would you take to accomplish this project?

- 1) Get authorization for an exact placement spot in the Jean Mayer Administration Bulding or Terracycle Disposable Mask box
- 2) Order the Terracycle boxes
- 3) Set up the Terracycle boxes
- 4) Inform the Tufts Grafton campus community about the placement of Terracycle boxes, placed in the Administration building where weekly COVID-19 testing is administered for all of the campus community, making it a convenient location for used mask drop-off

### 5. How would your project help the Tufts community?

The Tufts community on the Grafton campus currently does not have a sustainable way to dispose of their used disposable masks (provided by Tufts University for COVID-19 PPE). The implementation of Recycling boxes would assist the Tufts community to dispose of their masks in a safe and sustainable way, ensuring that the masks do not end up in our oceans and/or harming wildlife. As a veterinary school campus, the Grafton community members are extremely environmentally and wildlife conscious, so would be welcoming of an idea to avoid potentially negative impacts from our own PPE disposal.

#### What can I expect next?

The Green Fund Committee will meet in early October and decide which projects to advance to the second round. These projects will be asked to fill out a more complete application (which can be found at go.tufts.edu/GreenFund) these applicants will also be asked to fill out a budget and Gantt chart for their project as well as gain letters of support from vital parties.
